To be held as part of the 5th Cambridge Neuroscience Symposium 'Imaging the Nervous System'

We are inviting researchers to submit their favourite neuroscience images for entry. Both team and single-person entries are welcomed. We are looking for any image, data visualisation, or animation that illustrates the beauty of the nervous system across species. Separate prizes are available for images and animations. Shortlisted entries will be displayed during the 5th Cambridge Neuroscience Symposium, *Imaging the Nervous System*. Prizes will be awarded during the meeting.

Prizes will be awarded for two categories:

1. *Best overall image*
2. *Best Video Illustration*

Rules of Entry

1. Register with a work, or institutional E-mail address.
2. Submit your documents in a digital format via email to dg248@cam.ac.uk
3. **For images**, we recommend a minimum of at least 300 dots per inch, and require the following file formats for image submissions: **.jpg, .png, .gif**. Ideally, images should be sized for an A4 (or 8.5" x 11") sheet of paper. Maximum file size of 10 MB is appreciated.
4. **For videos**, we request that your video be a maximum of 5 minutes
5. Include a title and description summarising the content of your submission. Include details of equipment used to capture image (microscope, camera etc.) in your submission.
6. Low resolution (≤ 300 dpi) submissions will be excluded from competing although will be accepted as an initial submission (for purposes of email).
7. The participant(s) shall indemnify Cambridge Neuroscience against claims from third parties. In addition, in case (an alleged) infringement on third parties rights is made, (i) participants forfeit their right to an award or (ii) the organiser is entitled to reclaim an award which has already been given.
8. If an entry has been submitted elsewhere, it should be stated where. If a prize has been awarded list the type of award and date it was received.
9. It is the responsibility of the participant to ensure that permissions are obtained to use other people's data and content and correct attributions are made where necessary.
10. The organisers retain the right to make a pre-selection of all accepted submissions.
11. In case of multiple authors, please specify your full names and affiliation(s) in the text accompanying your submission.
12. The organisers retain the right to use submissions digitally, in print or in exhibits, or reproduce submitted material in any other way.
13. Submissions will be judged for aesthetic value, originality, scientific value and reproduction quality.
14. Deadline for submissions is August 14th 2015.
